1. Wear something blue

• Invite students to wear something blue (clothing or accessory) or something featuring the region.

2. Have fun while celebrating Gaspésie

- Organise a photobooth with blue props : Consult the Photobooth Guide.
- Create a collective work in blue.
- Play Gaspesian music in common areas: Playlist **HERE**
- Decorate your premises in blue.
- For cafeteria managers: add a touch of blue to the plates.
- Any other original idea.

Share your photos and be part of the big blue wave

- Take a photo of your collective work or activity.
- Share your photo on social media.

As part of Gaspesian Day, we suggest organizing a Photobooth for your students. This activity is easy to organize, fun, and creates beautiful memories!

Photobooth for Gaspesian Day



Before Getting Started (early May)

- Reminder: These points are suggestions, but you are in the best position to know which channels to use in your school to make this day a success!
- Identify a responsible person for the activity (e.g., leisure technician) and check the possibility of having a release.
- Check the interest and participation of students (student government).
- Check if an art teacher is interested in designing the sets with students.
- Form a student committee.
- Check if the school can allocate a budget for the set design materials.
- Any other ideas to boost the photobooth and increase the Gaspesian pride of this day are welcome.



One Week Before Gaspesian Day

- Identify the photobooth location: a common area or easily accessible passage for all students.
- Identify the activity time: lunchtime, break, students' arrival in the morning.
- Specify the visual theme and your concept: Variations around blue, presenting Gaspesian identities, typical Gaspesian decor, Gaspesian music, costumes, and accessories.
- Identify the elements of the future set and design them (or buy them).
- Identify a person who will take the photos on the day of the activity.
- Retrieve the order of temporary tattoos (gifts for participants) to be made through Vivre en Gaspésie.



During Gaspésie Day (or before June 6, 2024)

- Set up the set with the student committee and take photos: we can distribute them and highlight your activity!
- Invite students to share their photos (on a voluntary basis) on Vivre en Gaspésie's social media.
- Hand out 1 to 2 temporary tattoos (waterless) to participating students.
