**Did you know?** Rocher-Percé RCM is recognized for its UNESCO Global Geopark in Percé! This site showcases the region's exceptional geology, which is over 500 million years old.

**Did you know?** Jacques Cartier arrived in Gaspé in 1534 and claimed the land for France. Gaspé is thus considered the Birthplace of Canada. In fact, in 2034, Gaspé will celebrate its 500th anniversary!

**Did you know?** According to CASA, about 8,175 people in Gaspésie are English-speaking, representing roughly 10% of the region's population. Most live in the Bonaventure and Avignon RCMs.

Where is the heart of Acadian culture in Gaspésie?

**Did you know?** Bonaventure RCM is considered the heart of Acadian culture in Gaspésie. It includes towns founded by Acadian families after the 1755 deportation. The language, traditional music, festivals, and the Musée acadien du Québec in Bonaventure all proudly preserve this heritage. The World Acadian Congress will be held in the Baie-des-Chaleurs in 2029.

b) For Atlantic salmon fishing

**Did you know?** The Matapédia River is renowned for Atlantic salmon fishing and is considered one of Quebec's best salmon rivers. It attracts anglers from around the world and connects the Matapédia Valley with Gaspésie, forming a natural border with New Brunswick.

**Did you know?** In the Mi'gmaq language, Gespe'gewa'gi means 'where the land ends.' It refers to the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'gmaq people, who have inhabited this land since time immemorial.

Did you know? This village in La Haute-Gaspésie is famous for its cliffs overlooking the St. Lawrence River, making it a top destination for free flight. The mountain-sea station features an observatory with a stunning view.

Did you know? With an impressive 95.7%, Gaspésie has the highest regional sense of belonging in Quebec. The Côte-Nord and Nord-du-Québec follow at 82.3%, and Bas-Saint-Laurent at 76.3%. This shows deep-rooted pride among Gaspesians whether they still live there or have moved away, Gaspésie remains in their hearts.
